Background



• Good of the Internet initiative mission:

Support projects to improve services and tools for RIPE NCC members, the RIPE community, network operators and Internet users everywhere





- Executive Board has identified four different programs
 - These will be clearly and transparently described
 - Programs would be overseen by RIPE NCC Executive Board and RIPE community (with support from RIPE NCC)
- Executive Board will review the RIPE NCC's contributions on an annual basis

RIPE NCC Community Projects Fund

- Projects of value to the operation and resilience of the Internet
- Focus on tools and services of benefit to technical community in our service region
- Open application process
- Evaluated by committee:
 - Executive Board (1)
 - Working Group Chair (1)
 - RIPE community (3)
 - RIPE NCC observer (1)

Rob Blokzijl Foundation



- Recognises individuals who have made sustained and substantial technological or operational contributions to the development of the Internet in the RIPE NCC service region
 - Awarded once every two years
 - Initial direction from RIPE NCC, Executive Board and RIPE community
 - RIPE NCC providing initial funding



Seed Alliance



- Existing collaboration between AFRINIC, LACNIC, APNIC, and partner development agencies
- Small grants and awards to promote the information society (openness, rights, inclusion, networks and access)
- Funded 116 projects in 57 countries since inception in 2012
- Focus on digital innovation to support economic growth and social development

IETF Support



- Ensure IETF's long-term sustainability
- Discussed during RIPE NCC Services Working Group at RIPE 72 and May 2016 RIPE NCC General Meeting
- Received positive feedback from RIPE community
- Annual contribution for 10 years (2017-2026)
- AFRINIC, ARIN and ISOC also contributing
