





Annual IPv6 Delegations






Annual IPv4 Delegations

Annual IPv4 Transfers









- Foundation is now incorporated in Hong Kong

APNIC Survey 2016 Participation




Least Developing Developed Developed Economies Economies APNIC Members rate the service quality and value highly, with over 90% of respondents rating these positively

"Provide guidance & best industry practice to tackle those challenges. Example, technical training for IPV6, DNS Security. Increase IPV4 allocation per member would be good as well."


